FIRST READING: A reading from the 60<sup>th</sup> chapter of the book of Isaiah.

Jerusalem is assured that nations will make a pilgrimage to her, because the light of God's presence is in her midst. The bountiful food of the sea and the profits of international trade will come streaming to Jerusalem and thereby declare God's praise.

Arise, shine; for your light has come,

and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you.

<sup>2</sup>For darkness shall cover the earth,

<sup>5</sup>Then you shall see and be radiant;

because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you,

the wealth of the nations shall come to you.

<sup>6</sup>A multitude of camels shall cover you,

the young camels of Midian and Ephah;

all those from Sheba shall come.

They shall bring gold and frankincense,

and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

SECOND READING: A reading from the 3<sup>rd</sup> chapter of the book of Ephesians.

What had been hidden from previous generations is now made known through the gospel ministry of Paul and others. In Christ both Jews and Gentiles participate in the richness of God's promised salvation.

<sup>1</sup>This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—<sup>2</sup>for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, <sup>3</sup> and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, <sup>4</sup> a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. <sup>5</sup>In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: <sup>6</sup>that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

<sup>7</sup>Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. <sup>8</sup>Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, <sup>9</sup>and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; <sup>10</sup>so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. <sup>11</sup>This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, <sup>12</sup>in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

God's promise shines bright in the night as magi follow a star to honor a new king. Strangers from a faraway land, they welcome the long-awaited messiah of Israel.

The Holy Gospel reading for Epiphany Sunday is taken from the Gospel of Matthew, the 2<sup>nd</sup> chapter.

# Glory to you, O Lord.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup>asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." <sup>3</sup>When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; <sup>4</sup>and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. <sup>5</sup>They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

<sup>6</sup>'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

<sup>7</sup>Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. <sup>8</sup>Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." <sup>9</sup>When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup>When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. <sup>11</sup>On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. <sup>12</sup>And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

In keeping with the life and teaching of Christ Jesus, we joyfully and unconditionally welcome all people into our community of faith and affirm the worth of all people as unique individuals made in God's image. We are open to the special gifts that each person brings and invite each one to participate in the life of our church.

# HELPFUL WORSHIP TIME INFORMATION

**WELCOME** – We welcome all persons visiting this day. Please take time to fill out a visitor's card (found in the pew racks) and place it in the plate during the offering. You are invited to join us again! God be with you.

**CHILDREN'S WORSHIP BAGS** – The Evangelism Committee has prepared bags filled with crayons, pencils, coloring books, and a puzzle. These bags are for use of children ages 4-8 during the worship service. They are available prior to the service on a rack in the hall. Following the service, bags are to be returned to the rack for use on other Sunday mornings.

**SAFE AND SECURE REQUEST** – We at Zion's hold our regular worship services in our "2<sup>nd</sup> floor" worship area, well away from the entrances to our building. In order to secure those in attendance and our building during our worship times, we provide a Security Person each week to monitor the building and keep track of people in/around the building in case an emergency situation might arise. In order to help keep all people safe and secure during the times we are gathered for worship, we ask all to limit movement around other portions of the building to necessary purposes. Thank you.

**PARENTS OF CHILDREN 10 AND UNDER** – Please, for safety and liability reasons, we ask that, if your young child(ren) move from the worship area to other areas of the building, use the elevator, or sit in the balcony during our worship time together, they would always be accompanied by an adult. Thank you for your cooperation.

**BALCONY SEATING** – Those who desire to sit in the balcony are asked to sit on the east (Maxatawny) side of the balcony, so as not to interfere with our ministry of recording of the worship for our members with special circumstances who cannot be with us. Thank you.

**CELL PHONES** – In order to avoid any unneeded disruptions during our worship time together (unless you are an emergency responder), please make sure that all cell phones and other electronic devices are turned off before the start of worship. Thank you.

**CONGREGATIONAL ANNOUNCEMENTS** – In order to be good stewards of our worship time together, as we share announcements during our *Congregational Announcements*, we ask those sharings be limited to information concerning the ministries of the congregation (the committees, taskforces, organizations, and groups) and of our wider church, through our denominational and ecumenical affiliations.

**BULLETIN RECYCLING** – If you do not wish to keep your bulletin, as you leave, please drop your used bulletin in the recycling baskets located in the hall (by the doors) outside of the worship area. Thank you!

#### COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION INSTRUCTIONS:

- Everyone Please Fill Out a Communion Card and deposit it in the offering plate. We need to keep our records up to date. Visitors please note home church and address.
- As the usher comes to your row with the plates of bread and wine/grape juice, please pass them to the person in the center of the pew first. As the plates are passed back toward the aisle, then take the bread or wine/grape juice (juice in inner circle). All will take the bread and then the wine at the same time at the direction of the worship leader.
- Here at Zion's the bread is wheat and we offer both red wine and white grape juice (the center glasses in each tray). If you wish grape juice instead of wine and find that there is none in the tray when it comes to you, please alert the Communion Assistant. If your personal circumstances do not allow you to receive both the bread and wine/grape juice, please know that the gifts God graciously gives in this sacrament are fully given even if you only receive the bread or the wine/grape juice.
